## Abstract:

In this talk, I will give an account of the following paradigm:

a. We went (\*to) home

- b. We studied \*(at) home
- c. We stayed (at) home

When "home" is directional, as in (a), "to" is obligatorily absent. When "home" is a locative adjunct, as in (b), "at" is obligatorily present. When "home" is a locative complement, as in (c), "at" is optional.

My attempt to understand this paradigm will lead to discussions of unpronounced prepositions, light nouns, bare nouns, and particles.
